Hearing Loss vs. Deafness

Hearing loss may be mild, severe or profound. Deafness is usually profound hearing loss.

Prevalence in the U.S.

1 out of 5 men and 1 out of 8 women in the United States report having at least some trouble hearing.

Most common causes of hearing loss

Aging, noise exposure, head trauma, viruses or diseases, genetics and cytotoxicity.

Misconceptions about ASL

American Sign Language (ASL) is not universal. Each country has its own sign language with its own regional dialects.

Some unique features of Deaf Culture

Reliance on eyesight, high degree of networking, use of technology to overcome traditional communication barriers, and supporting sign language use in educational settings.
